William and Agnes Hoston Memorial Scholarship 2024 APPLICATION AND GUIDELINES

The Youth Essential Skills (YES) is a non-profit community-based organization with the vision to develop underserved youth for social responsibility in the community and in the workplace. YES strives to equip youth with essential soft skills through programs within our four primary modules: Social, Leadership, Health and Education.

The YES scholarship is in partnership with and is partially funded by The William and Agnes Hoston Memorial Scholarship fund that honors the life and legacy of a couple who epitomized community leadership and service through advocacy for literacy, higher education, voter participation, and job creation. Together, William and Agnes, promoted the importance of education, and sacrificed so that all five of their children were able to obtain college degrees. They influenced and positively impacted so many lives, and this scholarship will allow this impact to continue. YES supports the Hoston Memorial educational efforts.

The purpose of this scholarship is to increase the number of underserved youth who are aspiring to attend higher education institutions. Although the scholarship targets all underserved youth, African American candidates will receive a higher rating.

Eligibility

Candidates for an this scholarship must meet the following eligibility criteria:

- GPA: 2.5 or higher
- A graduating high school senior who has applied to one or more accredited colleges/universities (junior colleges and above).
- SAT or ACT official scores (optional)
- Extracurricular Activities
- Recommendation letters (2)
- Essay (600 words or less)
- Resident of San Bernardino and Riverside

Selection

Scholarship recipients will be selected each spring by the organization's scholarship committee. Recipients will receive notification of their selection prior to the end of their senior school year.

Awards

Scholarship of \$1,000 or more will be awarded to the recipient prior to the end of the high-school school year. Awards are made to the students upon presentation of proof of enrollment at an accredited college or university. The student may be provided the opportunity to select how their award will be presented (e.g., bookstore certificate, computer, etc.).

The Application Package

Consideration will be given only to candidates submitting complete application packages which include: (1) a completed application form (copies are acceptable); (2) a high school transcript (unofficial is okay); (3) official proof of ACT or SAT scores (optional); (4) two recommendation letters, one academically related and one service related; (5) a letter from the student introducing yourself and providing anything you would like for the committee to know about you; (6) an essay meeting the outlined requirements; and (7) a completed checklist. Please redact Social Security Numbers from any documents.

- I have composed the requested essay that is 600 words or less, and it has been proofread for typing errors, grammar, focus on main point, structure, organization, content and clarity.
- I have attached a copy of the official record of my ACT and/or SAT scores (optional).
- I have attached two (2) recommendation letters: 1) academically related; and 2) service related.
- I have attached a personal introduction letter.
- I am a resident of San Bernardino or Riverside County
- I have additional sheets, as needed, listing all school and community extracurricular activities.
- My name appears on ALL attachments.
